

Introducing the new Sensory Walks, located in the hallway by the gym and upstairs on the ramp near the music room.

The perfect place for students to release energy and regain focus on classroom tasks.

Below is important information regarding the new sensory walks:

- Research shows that movement throughout the school day may help to support school skills, such as time on tasks and academics.  
For students to acquire these academic skills they need the underlying abilities of appropriate attention, behavior, engagement, comprehension, and memory.  
While not every child needs physical activity breaks to remain on-task, offering the breaks is shown to help many of the students, especially those who were more off task initially.  
In a study including a group of 4<sup>th</sup> grade students, they reported that after 10 minutes of activity breaks once a day for 12 weeks, there was clear improvement in on-task behavior, especially for the students who were least on-task initially.
- Activities that include proprioceptive, vestibular, deep pressure and visual input are used based on the theory that this type of input effects arousal levels. These types of input have been used clinically to increase alertness and to produce a calm state, supporting the student's ability to attend and learn.
  - ◇ Physical activity has been hypothesized to increase levels of neurochemicals including dopa-  
mine and serotonin.
  - ◇ Offering the children the necessary proprioceptive and vestibular input could help the child to  
refocus and attend which ultimately increases cognition and retention of new information.
- The best time for the walk is in the mid-morning, after lunch, after a long test or assignment, after specials or anytime the children seem to need a break from their work. Also good to use during PSSA testing.



### From the Desk of Ms. Lu, Certified School Nurse:

Reminder about school medication policy: As specified in the Elementary Student Handbook under "Health Services", please note the following:

Parent and physician signatures are required for administration of all prescription and over-the-counter medications. Medication Consent forms are available in the nurses' office or on the district website. A parent or adult designee must transport all medications to and from school including any over-the-counter medications such as Tylenol."

#### **Is my child sick?**

When should I keep my child at home? A temperature elevation of 100 or more, a severe sore throat, chronic cough, sinus infection or ear pain are all reasons to keep your child home. Usually the second or third day of a respiratory infection is the most challenging.

**Please do NOT send your child to school if you needed to give Tylenol to control fever. Your child is STILL considered ill.**

Good hand washing techniques, lots of fluids and extra rest will help your child cope and reduce the spread of illness. Sending a water bottle with your child's name on it encourages fluid consumption. If in doubt, feel free to call me at 389-1876 and we can discuss your child's condition.

#### **FEBRUARY IS DENTAL HEALTH MONTH**

Each February, the American Dental Association sponsors National Children's Dental Health Month to raise awareness about the importance of oral health. Developing good habits at an early age and scheduling regular dental visits helps children get a good start on a lifetime of healthy teeth and gums. During February, please consider reinforcing good dental health habits with twice daily brushing!

Our school dental examinations were given Friday, January 10, 2020 . If you received a notice that your child needs additional attention with a dentist, please schedule that appointment as soon as possible. Good dental health and overall health go hand in hand. If you need assistance in finding a dentist for your child, please call Ms. Lu at 717-389-1876.

#### **Old Clothes?**

If you have clothes that your child has outgrown such as **sweat pants, shorts, t-shirts, and belts**, please consider donating them to the nurses' office. We go through a lot of clothing each week when students' clothing becomes soiled or wet. Thanks!

#### **WINTER RECESS**

**Whenever possible, the students go outside daily for recess. Unless requested by a doctor's note, all students who are eligible for recess will go outside. On days when it is extremely cold, and there is a very low wind chill factor, there will be no outside recess. Please be sure that your child is always dressed properly for the cold weather in the event that there IS outside recess. If you need winter outerwear (coat, hat, gloves), please let me know.**


