

## OUR MISSION:

The Falcon Foundation helps students, teachers, and families in the Cornwall-Lebanon School District by funding (or partially funding) grants, awards, scholarships and capital improvement projects. The following are the principle funding programs sponsored by the Falcon Foundation:

**Student Educational Opportunity Awards** are granted on the basis of need and/or superior achievement warranting recognition. Foundation awards for district students may be used for workshops, camps and other enrichment opportunities.

**Employee Educational Opportunity Awards** are available to CLSD employees for courses, workshops or other professional development opportunities not required for salary advancement or continuing education units (CEUs).

**Project Grants** are awarded for innovative programs or initiatives that supplement the normal curriculum and extracurricular activities of CLSD. Anyone may apply for these grants to provide enrichment or remedial activities to Cornwall-Lebanon students or adults.

### **Thomas A. Sherk Scholarship**

This scholarship was created in 2009 by the Falcon Foundation to honor the years of service and dedication Thomas A. Sherk provided to the Cornwall-Lebanon School District. This \$1,000 non-renewable scholarship is open to any senior student enrolled at Cedar Crest High School who plans to major in mathematics or mathematics education at a four-year institution.

### **Capital Projects**

The Falcon Foundation has helped fund many important capital improvement projects throughout the Cornwall-Lebanon School District. Noteworthy projects include: development of a high-tech television studio at the high school; SMART boards and projectors in the middle school and elementary schools; mobile agricultural education science lab visits; upgrades to the high school's planetarium; graphic arts lab at the high school and enhancements to athletic facilities at Earl W. Boltz Stadium, including the Edward and Jeanne Arnold Athletic Field and the Falcon Foundation Field House. In 2014, The Foundation supported the creation of the Falcon Perch Coffee shop for CCHS students in the work-based learning program.

## Today's Tournament Format is a Regular 4-Person Scramble

### Rules for a Regular 4-Person Scramble:

- All teams play their 1<sup>st</sup> hole from the white tee markers.
- After each player tees off, the team decides which of the four balls is best. The other three players must pick up their balls and move to the location of the selected ball. All four players hit their next shot from the selected location, no more than one club distance away from where the ball came to rest and no closer to the hole. The ball's lie may not be improved. For example, the ball shall not be moved from rough to fairway, sand to rough, etc.
- The process of selecting the best shot location is repeated until the ball reaches the green.
- All players putt from the same location until the ball is holed out.
- Women and seniors (age 65 and older) have the option to play each hole from the gold tee marker.

### Hole Contests and Other Games:

- 1st, 2nd and 3rd place team prizes will be awarded.
- A prize also will be awarded to the team with the lowest score in the "Educators Division" (for teams comprised of at least two current or former Cornwall-Lebanon School District employees).
- The men's and women's straightest drive competition will be contested on hole #14. A prize will be awarded to the winner of each respective division.
- The men's closest-to-the-pin competition will be contested on hole #15. The women's closest-to-the-pin competition will be contested on hole #13. A prize will be awarded to the winner of each respective division.
- A "casino" game will be contested on hole #18. Two (2) circles (20-foot and 40-foot) will be drawn on the green centered on the hole. Each player will have the opportunity to bet up to \$20.00. If the player's ball comes to rest anywhere inside the 40-foot circle, or touching the line, the player wins double his or her bet. If the player's ball comes to rest anywhere inside the 20-foot circle, or touching the line, the player wins triple his or her bet. If the player's ball comes to rest outside of the 40-foot circle, the bet is lost.
- Win \$10,000 with a hole-in-one on hole #9. To be fair, all tee markers will be placed at the same location on hole #9. Hole-in-one prizes also will be available on holes #6, #15 and #18. Any player who scores a hole-in-one will win the prize displayed at the tee of the hole.

### \$5,000 Putting Challenge Raffle, Mulligans & Door Prizes:

- Raffle tickets are available for \$20.00 per player.
- One (1) raffle ticket will be selected randomly immediately prior to tournament where the ticket holder will have a shot at winning \$5,000 by holing out a 50-foot putt.
- Purchase of raffle ticket also entitles player to two (2) mulligans during round.
- Door prizes also will be awarded, so players should retain their raffle ticket(s).
