Orientation for parents (only) of children entering kindergarten in Fall 2020 is Thursday, February 20, 2020, at Union Canal Elementary School, 6:00 p.m.

We are also starting to plan next school year here at Union Canal. While, these discussions are still broad in nature, we're starting to outline what Union Canal will look like next school year. Again this year we will be having a "Step-Up" day at the end of our school year for students to be able to 'Step-Up' to their grade level, class, and teacher of the 2020-21 school year. Discussion Topics for parents speaking about Character with their children...

Acceptance and Diversity...

Here are some great ways to communicate about this topic with your children. I encourage all parents to set aside time once a week to discuss and actively work together on this month's topic.

#1: Search Google Maps Together

A great place to start is by having a globe or a world map available in your home. Get the computer, tablet, or phone out and search around the world with Google Maps. When something globally newsworthy happens, the kids can go right to the map and physically see that area of the world. This allows them opportunities to ask questions, engage in discussion, and creates teachable moments for the whole family.

#2: Encourage Questions

If your child has questions about differences in physical characteristics or cultural practices, discuss them openly. This teaches your child that it's okay to notice differences, and more importantly, it teaches him that it's good to talk about them. Learning to appreciate all kinds of differences—not just racial and cultural but differences in socioeconomic levels, gender, and even disabilities is an important skill in today's diverse society.

#3: Recommended Books on Culture, Race, and Disability

[David's Drawings](#) by Cathryn Falwell

Perfect for: Ages 7 – 10

What it's about: One wintry morning, David, a shy African-American boy, spies a beautiful tree on his way to school. Before class begins, he gets a paper and pencil and draws its trunk and bare branches. Soon, his schoolmates look on and make suggestions. In this gentle and appealing story, a boy figures out how to stay true to his own artistic vision while allowing his friends to express their own creativity.

[Black, White, Just Right!](#) by Marguerite W. Davol

Perfect for: Ages 2-5

What it's about: A mixed-race child celebrates the rich inclusiveness of her life in a joyful picture book. Mama's face is chestnut brown, Papa's face turns pink in the sun, the child's a little dark, a little light, and "Just right!"

[Stinky the Bulldog](#) by Jackie Valent

Perfect for: 3 and under

What it's about: Stinky is a lovable little bulldog who moves to a new neighborhood. The mama bulldog teaches Stinky a valuable lesson in not judging others in this colorful picture book.

[Special People, Special Ways](#) by Arlene Maguire

Perfect for: Grade 2 and up

Special People, Special Ways presents a positive image of persons with disabilities. It shares the message that even though each of us may have something different about us, we share many commonalities. Coupled with colorful illustrations, the book conveys the message that although painful at times, being different can also be wonderful.

Perfect for: 3 and up

What it's about: A little boy learns compassion and patience as he cares for his little sister, who has Down's Syndrome.

Kindergarten Registration and Orientation

Welcome to Kindergarten!

Please log onto the Cornwall-Lebanon School District web site for kindergarten registration instructions. Go to "Departments" tab and scroll down to "Student Registration". On the left hand side, you will see "Kindergarten Registration". Clicking on that will open up the "Welcome to Kindergarten" page.

Kindergarten Registration involves three steps. The first step is to sign up online. After you sign up on line, you will receive an email inviting you to Parent Orientation Night. The third step is an individualized kindergarten registration meeting at the school building. You will select a date and time for registration at Parent Orientation Night (date and time listed below).

Orientation – Thursday, February 20, 6:00 p.m.

Parent Orientation Night will be held at your school building. This evening is designed for *parents* of incoming kindergartners. Please find alternative care for your child(ren) for that evening. You will get a chance to hear about the kindergarten program at Cornwall-Lebanon and take a tour of the kindergarten classrooms. There will also be a question/answer period with the principal and kindergarten teachers. At orientation, the school secretaries will be available to set up an appointment for your child's registration. When scheduling your appointment time, please keep in mind that registration will take approximately 1 1/2 hours.

A packet of information will be available for each family. Contained in this packet will be forms that you should complete prior to registration. If you are unable to attend this meeting, the packet of information will be available in your child's designated building office.

Registration – March 19 and March 20th, 2020

At registration, you and your child will be visiting with the school nurse to review enrollment and health papers and a parent interview will take place with a qualified staff member. A brief student assessment and short speech and language screening will be conducted that day with your child.

Please bring the following to THIS appointment:

- **Completed** forms (found in packet to be received at Parent Orientation Night).
- Your child's immunization record.
- Your child's birth certificate.
- Proof of residency (Deed, Lease Agreement or Mortgage Statement; Tax Statement; Proof of Liability for Municipal and School District Taxes).
- Custody Order, CLSD-approved guardianship form, CLSD-approved shared housing form.
- Physical Exam
- Dental Exam
- Your child!

Reminders!

Your child is registered for **Union Canal Elementary School**. Both Orientation Night and Registration will take place at this school. Traditionally, children are registered at the building where they will be attending, and we plan to continue with this process. However, we do want to alert parents to the fact that some children in borderline building attendance areas may be assigned to a different elementary building for kindergarten in order to make the most efficient use of space and teaching personnel.

Character Trait Assemblies

Students discuss the character traits of Respect, Kindness/Courtesy, Self-Discipline, Friendship, Perseverance, Diversity/Acceptance, Responsibility, Honesty and Caring throughout the school year. Every month the students focus on a specific character trait. The trait is discussed at an assembly to show some examples of the trait and it's importance.
