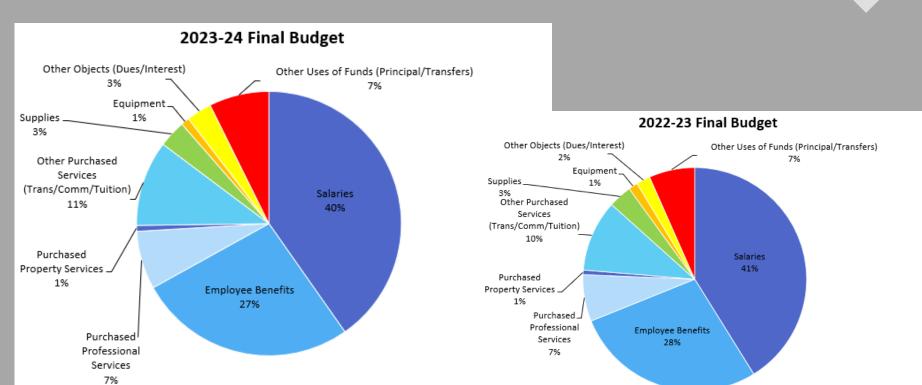
PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTION RATES



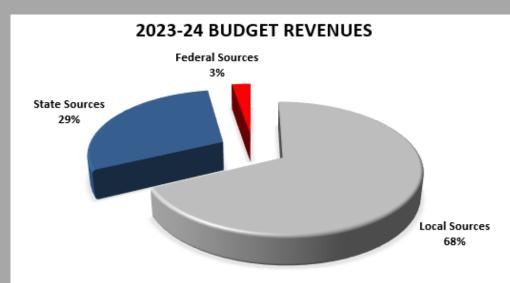

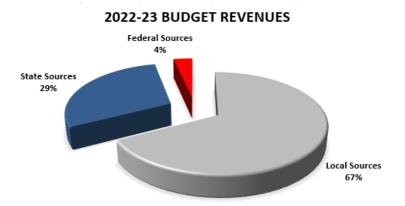
